
Please send your dues ASAP. Your dues are essential to enable us to pay the rent! Remember our ONLY source of income is from dues and donations.

GENEALOGY TIPS

- 1. Write everything down as you find it. Information on your family tree will grow quickly and if you want to avoid errors you should write things down as you discover them.
- 2. Don't use your own abbreviations. Use standard ones such as **b** for **born**, **d** for **died** and **m** for **married**.
- 3. Always record your sources. Include the name, location and date of the source, as well as the date you discovered it.
- 4. Keep a copy of any letters you send out or receive. You may need to refer to them later, as well, it's a handy way of ensuring you don't write the same people twice accidently.
- 5. When recording dates, use the full date such as 10 April 1645 rather than 10/4/45.

Nancy Thomas Reese was born in Virginia in the year 1834, and died at her home, near South Charleston, Ohio, December 29, 1910, at the age of 75 years. She was married to Hiram Reese in 1852, and was the daughter of Jacob and Sallie Thomas, being next to the youngest of six children, viz: Don, Caleb, Mary, Nancy, James and Rebecca. The three brothers and two sisters died many years ago.

Her father, Jacob Thomas, was a brother of Joseph Thomas, known as "White Pilgrim", and of Moses and Griffith Thomas. Joseph Thomas, the "White Pilgrim," came to Ohio from Virginia and located in Stokes township, near Grassy Point Church. Afterwards his three brothers, Moses, Griffith and Jacob, came to Ohio and all located in Stokes township, and each became the head of large families, and with the going of Nancy Reese all have passed to the Great Beyond, except Aunt Lydia Hornbeck, whose father was Griffith Thomas.

Aunt Lydia Hornbeck is 84 years of age, and the only living member of the four large families named above.

Caleb Thomas, brother of Nancy Reese, and her cousin, Joseph Thomas, son of Griffith Thomas, under the influence of their uncle, Joseph Thomas, the "White Pilgrim", became misisters of the Gospel, Caleb locating in Missouri and Joseph in Indiana, where they continued as preachers and members of the Christian Church; the ch church established by their uncle. Both of these divines have been dead many years.

Mary Thomas, eldest sister of Nancy Reese, became the wife of Hugh Orr and the mother of the present post master at South Solon.

Mrs. Reese became a member of the Christian Church in 1884, and was a devoted member of the church the remainder of her life.

The funeral services were held in the Christian Church at South Solon at 1:30 o'clock Sunday, New Year's Day, and the remains buried in South Solon cenetery, where rests the ashes of a large number of the Thomas relationship.

154th Regiment, Co. I

Lewellen Yocum: Buried in Indiana. William H. Jones: Living near Lafayette, Ohio. The 154th was put on guard and picket duty while the veterans were sent to join the army of the Patomc with Grant in the Wilderness and

siege of Petersburg, and capture of Richmond, and was in no important battle, but engaged in some serious skirmishes.

3rd Regiment, Co. E.

Enlisted June 23, '98: mustered out October 26, '98. Richard Kavanaugh: Living in London, Ohio. Thaddeus Keifer: Living in Columbus, Ohio. William Kinner: Buried in Kirkwood cemetery, London, Ohio. James Herdman: Buried in Pike county, Ohio. Charles Young: Living in Springfield, Ohio.

One soldier of the war of the revolution is buried in Paint township cemetery: Andrew Sifrit.

WAR of 1812

The following veterans of the war of 1812 are buried in Paint township cemetery: William Coberly, James Kilgore, Uriah Thornburg, Sr., David Watson, Sr., Dennet Wagner, James Wagner, Samuel Baskerville and Captain Langan are buried in the Baskerville cemetery, Paint township. This roster is not claimed to be accurate. There are some mistakes and omissions, but it is as near correct as the opportunity to collect information and dates was at hand.
