#### STRAYER

Mrs. Hester Strayer died on Thursday last at the residence of Mrs. Gosslee in this place, of cancer of the stomach, aged about 76 years. Her husband died about eleven years ago, and for the past seven years the deceased had been making her home in London. She was the mother of Samuel Strayer of Columbus and Hanson Strayer of Tiffin, well known in mercantile circles. She was a consistent member of the M.E. Church for the past fifty years. The remains were taken to Ciecleville, her former home, for interment on Friday.

#### WOODRUFF

Henry Woodruff, a well respected young man of Plain City, aged about 30 years, died very suddenly last Monday morning. He was suffering from a gathering on one of his fingers, and while undergoing amputation of the member, and being under the influence of chloroform, administered by Drs. Jenkins and McCune, he gave a gasp and fell back dead. His wife is dead, and he leaves one child. Funeral services will be held tomorrow.

The report is current here that Jimmy Gallagher, formerly living on Center Street, this place, was found dead in his house in Springfield last Monday. Death probably resulted from heart disease.

## Wednesday April 11, 1883

Mrs. Harriet Minshall was called to Morrow, Warren county, last Sunday by the sudden death of her brother, Dr. Thomas Littleton, a prominent physician of that place.

#### BESCHER

Flora, daughter of Mr. Anton Bescher, Jr. and wife, died at their residence on South Main street on Wednesday morning last of membranous croup, aged about fourteen months. The remains of the little one were interred in Kirkwood cemetery on Thursday last. The parents have the sympathy of their friends in their bereavement.

#### WOODS

Maggie, a small daughter of Michael and Mary Woods, died at their home in Galloway, of whooping cough, last Monday and was buried in the Catholic cemetery near this place yesterday (Tuesday)morning.

#### MITCHEM

Mrs. Catharine Mitchem died at her home in Columbus last • Sunday of consumption, aged about 51 years. The remains were brought here for burial and interred in the Paint township cemetery Monday.

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The first Board of County Commissioners of Madison county were appointed in 1810, and the first meeting was held on June 11th of that year at the house of Thomas Gwynne. The Board consisted of Joshua Ewing, John Arbuckle (the head of the Arbuckle family), and William Gibson. The latter was chosen Clerk of the Board. Patrick McLene, who was afterwards the founder of London, was appointed lister of all the resident land in the county. John Moore, the Sheriff, was chosen as tax collector, and Thomas Gwynne as County Treasurer. The Commissioners were asked to take some steps towards the extermination of wolves, as the ravages of these animals had become very destructive to the settlers' live stock, and it was decided to offer a reward of \$2 for the scalp of every, wolf over six months old, and \$1 for those under the same age, on and after the first of Harch, 1810. On the 17th of June Thos. Gwynne was paid \$2 for the first wolf scalp, and Wm. Atkinson laid claims for nine scalps.

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Baskerville received \$10 50 for his services as Judge of Common Pleas, and Robert Hume was engaged as Clerk. The first three judges of election paid by the Commissioners were Luther Carey, of Darby township, John Moore and John Arbuckle.

P. McLene, surveyor, hired two young men named Isaac Hudson and Abraham Denton as chain carriers and they each received \$4 for their services.

The office of Commissioner was not a very lucrative one - J. Ewing receiving only \$7 for services up to Nov. 20th, 1810. About this time the settlers became seriously interested in the establishment of a highway as a medium of communication with the more thickly populated outside world. The first minute we have of this movement is dated Sept. 3d, when "a petition was presented by the inhabitants of Union and Stokes townships, praying for the establishment of a road from Minor's Ford on Deer Creek, running westbound, leaving Andrew Cyford's plantation to the 'south, and Jacob Blocker's plantation north of said road, making the second from the beginning at or near John Mozer's on the Great Prairie; Thence on the best ground to the Greene county line at or near Jacob Miller's. Jeremiah Minor, Andrew Cyford and John Moore were appointed views to meet at the house of M Gurman Here "

Minor, Andrew Cyford and John Moore were appointed views to meet at the house of T. Gwynne, Esq." On the same day, the inhabitants of Union and Pleasant townships petitioned for a road running from the end of the Chillicothe road, near John Page's to Urbana. Peter Helphenstine, Hugh Montgomery and William Lewis were appointed viewers. Both roads were granted.
