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EARLY DAYS IN MADISON COUNTY CONTINUED.... February 9, 1881

Feb. 23d, 1811, a State road was opened from Xenia to John Gwynne's at the intersection of the road from Franklinton to Dayton, "from the 64th mile tree to the 25th mile tree."

March 5th, 1811, a road was ordered opened from Wm. Frankbarger's to John Gwynne's.

On the 3d day of September, 1813, an alteration was made between the 21st and 22d mile tree of the road leading from the county seat of Fayette county through London to Mitchell's settlement on Darby.

On the 7th of March, 1814, a road was prayed for from the Fayette county line to Patterson's Mill on the Little Miami, to Greene county line.

Nov. 21st, 1810, Jonathan Minshall was chosen Commissioner. David

Mitchell and Saml. Baskerville were judges of November court.

Dec. 3rd, 1810, "The Commissioners met agreeably to adjournment, at the house of Thos. Gwynne, Esq.: present Joshua Ewing, Jonathan Minshall and Wm. Gibson. They preceded, according to law, to cast lots for the time each should continue as a Commissioner, and said lottery was decided in the following manner, viz: Jonathan Minshall, Esq., for three years from the last October election; Wm. Gibson due for two years, and Joshua Ewing, due for one year, his time to expire next October election, 1811."

Patrick McLene was paid \$21 25 for trying to establish the county lines.

John Peppers was the first clerk of election (October 9, 1810,) in Deercreek township. Wm. Ross was paid 75 cts. for making a ballot box for Deercreek township-(at a recent election (1881) the Commissioners paid \$56 for 14 ballot boxes.)

George Jackson and John Pollock were paid \$14 each for services for

fixing on a place fit for county seat.

David Bradley, Lewis Foster, Henry Smith, James Moon, Paul Alder,. Frederick Lloyd and Nehemiah Gates were paid as election judges and clerks of Jefferson township.

John Moon, Sheriff, took an abstract of this county to Franklin

County.
'Ordered, that there be allowed to Robert Shannon, Esq., associate Judge of Franklin county, the sum of \$6 for attending at the town of Franklinton at the request of P. L. Lewis, Esq., director of the town of Madison, and directing him how to proceed and fix the day of sale of the lots in the said town of Madison. (We are unable to find out whers the town of Madison was situated, but presume it must have been the settlement on the Gwynne lands, about five miles north of London, afterwards called "Limerick."-REp.)

Ordered same sums to Wm. Reed, associate Judge, Alex. Morrison, associate Judge, and Elmar N. Delasmutt, Sheriff of Franklin county.

Jan. 8, 1811. New jail ordered in the town of Madison, to cost \$150. Peter Prugh was paid \$3 for making a pair of hand-cuffs and fetters for the use of the county to put on John Bright, a prisoner.

Robt. Hume was paid \$9.95 for books and traveling expenses to Chillicothe

to procure the same.

P. McLene was paid \$6 for surveying an alteration in the State Road near Gwynne's, and another in the road from Fayette county, running in the direction of Urbana. .

MADISON COUNTY DEMOCRAT Wed. Jan. 13, 1897

Mrs. Maria Roberts, relict of the late Edwin Roberts, died at her home on the London and Jefferson Pike in Jefferson township on Friday last, aged about 65 years. Her maiden name was Maria Thomas, a daughter of John Thomas, one of Madison County's some years ago, leaving several grown children, including his son Matt. Mrs. and Pierce Gregg, another daughter, Mrs. Jas. J. Sidner, dying recently. The funeral services were held at the home last Sunday afternoon, conducted by Rev. Hixvon, of West Jefferson. The remains were interred in the Jefferson cemetery.

CONVERSE

Julia Ann Converse, daughter of James and Elizabeth Calhoon, was born on the Big Darby Plains, Madison county, Ohio, Oct. 30, 1826, and died of heart failure at her late home in Canaan township, May11, 1893.

Those of her early associates who yet remain this side of the bourne to which she has been called, remember her in those pioneer days, and speak of her as a young woman whose rare mental endowments and fine qualities of heart drew around her and made her the center of the little social world in which she moved; and this gentle spirit of love and benevolence crowned every passing day of her after life and glorified its closing hours with an

everlasting beauty and peace.

In 1846 at the age of twenty years, she was joined in marriage to James N. Converse, and honorable and ambitious young farmer of her own ' neighborhood, and for nearly forty years they lived together a life of unbroken domestic felicity. God, in His tenderness to him in all these long years even shielded their fireside from the shadow of death; and when the husband passed to the higher estate, his was the first and only chair that stood vacant in her household. God had seemingly been tender to them that they might through His bounty be generous and bountiful to others. They had been happy and prosperous because they had been industrious and mindful in all things of the requirements of life; they had been the kindest of neighbors, the truest in sympathy and council and the most ready in silent acts of christion benevolence; their home had been made the synonym of comfort, cheerfulness and open hospitality; and so his going was not a trial of bitternesss to her, but one of promise and surety of deeper blessings yet to come than this life can afford to the most faithful of God's children. The children of this union are Elizabeth, wife of Mr. A. C. Millikin, and H. B. Converse, Esq. of Canaan township.

James N. Converse, the husband, died on the 21st of May, 1887, at the Converse home, to which they had moved from near the old Calhoon homestead twenty nine years ago, and from that time to the close of her own life, Aunt Julia(with the rare exception of a few months) remained on the home farm, whence it seemed to be her one ardent desire to go forth some summer day and walk again with him in a union never again to be broken by death.

The simplicity of Aunt Julia Converse's life broadened, and deepened, and strengthened her faith in God as a loving Father whose tenderness allows not the least of His children to move beyond His love and mercy; and in this faith she early in life joined with the Universalist Church, and a few years later was one of the organizers of the organizers of the Alder Chapel congregation. In the example of this christian faith, she unconsciously drew people nearer to her and taught them the true beauty of holiness. She was the friend of all humanity, and her unceasing care for the welfare and feelings of others gave to her old age a grace that was lovable and tints the memory of her years with the pathos of lasting affection. It was her nature to be kind, generous and true, and it was her reward to go down into old age gracefully and pass beyond into the new life, mourned by loving children and revered by men and women whose homes were made happy and whose lives were made better by the example of her life as she walked with them on earth.
